In 2004, members of the Norway House Cree Nation's Residential School Survivors Group were able to secure funds from the federal government to establish a bursary for graduating students. The Survivors felt that it is important that the new generation be given support to help Aboriginal people reclaim their own history to help build a healthy future.

The Reclaiming Our History Bursary is designed to acknowledge a First Nations student whose character, accomplishments and lifestyle embody traits of survivorship, honour and respect for culture and an understanding of community, while still achieving an acceptable academic standing.

## **Eligibility:**

Due to the interpretative nature of these criteria, a number of guidelines are offered, with the understanding that character also has many intangible qualities which may be more difficult to define such as:

- Significant improvement in academic standing from Grades 9 to Grade 12.
- > Demonstrated commitment in the face of personal challenges.
- > Participation in cultural or community activities.
- Stewardship and support of fellow students and the community.
- > Demonstrated awareness, honour and respect for others.

She worked to improve the future of children both in her professional role and in her service to child and family governance and post-secondary education programming. Her legacy was left in many ways and a memorial bursary is just one extension of her vision.

## **Eligibility:**

The Daisy Monias Memory Bursary is intended to recognize the achievements of a strong Indigenous female who demonstrates the following qualities:

- Exceptional leadership, both in formal roles and in character
- Respect for Indigenous culture, language and ways of knowing
- Commitment to the pursuit of education
